It helps students with complex problem-solving, cognition, physical development, social skills, agency, and so much more, all while having fun and creating art.

Lynnwood High School Royal Robotics Team Wins Gracious Professionalism Award!

The Lynnwood High School Royal Robotics team recently competed in the Hawaii Regionals after three intense weeks of competition in Glacier Peak and Bonney Lake.

Despite setbacks due to the recent technology outage in the District, affecting 2.5 weeks of their six week practice season, the team persevered with completing their robot in time for competition.

They also continued to hold a practice field daily after build season with 1778 Chill Out of Mountlake Terrace High School at Former Alderwood Middle School. This allowed up to six other teams to practice driving their robot ahead of competition.

The team's willingness to provide space and time for other students to practice and perfect their robots earned the Royal Robotics not one, but two, Gracious Professionalism awards!

The team also qualified to attend the PNW District Championships. Although the team ranked 23 in the playoffs and didn't make it to the World Championship (only 22 teams can go of 150 teams), we are so very proud of their hard work and "coopertition"! Way to go Royal Robotics!!
